Webinar on rich podcast for SSE partners

The Senior Social Entrepreneurship project has promoted a webinar on enriched podcasting. The webinar was held to provide partners with specific training in the creation of this type of audiovisual products.

Podcasting is a sound product that is currently experiencing a significant growth. Enriched podcast tries to give a creative twist to the proposal by adding images and textual information to the sound element.

The webinar took place in the month of June for two days. The first session dealt with fundamental aspects for the creation of an enriched podcast. Specifically, we talked about the planning and sequencing of the work, the search for sound material (audio effects and music) and quality images in databases and free online files. This was followed by the editing and editing of a sound piece stages (the podcast) with Audacity, a free downloadable programme.

On the second and final day, the training focused on enriching the sound piece created in the previous session. In this case, with the help of Premiere Pro software (Adobe), all the material was edited to synchronise the sound with the images. It was also shown how to add titles to the images, in order to enrich the piece with textual information. And finally, we proceeded to show how to insert subtitles for the English version of the finished product.

The course attendance and participation were remarkable. The two webinar sessions were also recorded for later consultation.

Athens hosts first face-to-face meeting of the SSE project after a long period of online sessions

Athens hosted the first face-to-face meeting of the SSE project on the 8th of September, after a long period of virtual sessions motivated by health restrictions due to COVID-19. In addition to the host partner Gunet, representatives of GEA, UMA, WIN and USE attended the meeting. In virtual mode, Qualed and TAUS participated in the working session.

As the SSE project enters the last phase of implementation, the meeting was intended to motivate the partners to address the remaining tasks to be delivered and to present the results which are already completed or in the process of completion.

The meeting provided an opportunity to share the extended and short editions of the magazines with the partners. The content of the publications, designed in digital format, reflects the experience of a senior entrepreneur representing each country of the consortium.

From teaching to entrepreneurship in the livestock sector, the businesswoman founded La Dehesa de los Monteros

Chelo Gámez swapped the classroom for the lush landscapes of the Genal river valley. In 2008, the now livestock farmer created La Dehesa de los Monteros, a company dedicated to raising 100% Iberian pigs. La Dehesa's products are in demand by the most important chefs in the world. The company's work contributes to caring for the environment and the local economy. However, Chelo's Iberian dream will be realised when the golden blond pig breed is recognised.



From mayor to social entrepreneur. His construction company employs many Roma

Vladimír Ledecký, mayor of Spišský Hrhov for two decades, founded a municipal company. The ompany gradually built up the village in eastern Slovakia. The vast majority of the company's employees are Roma who, together with non-Roma, live peacefully together. The success of the municipal company has been the creation of laws in a place where there were none. Today, Spišský Hrhov is governed by the law of social enterprises, which improves the living conditions of its inhabitants.
